

# FARMER KILLED IN JUMBO ATTACK; People lay siege to road, seek PROTEST MOUNTS IN ATHIRAPPILLY solution to elephant menace

Forest minister to reach Chalakudy on Monday and hold a meeting to discuss the issue

THE DEATH OF a farmer in wild elephant attack at Vettillappara near Athirappilly in Thrissur district has brought to fore the ever escalating human-wildlife conflict in Kerala.

Three persons have lost their lives in wild elephant attacks in the state during the past week putting pressure on Forest Minister Shibu Baby John to address the grievances. The minister who promised concrete steps was guarded in his reaction while saying there is no simple solution for the conflict. It is to be noted that the escalating conflict was one of the prime issues that made the previous LDF government unpopular in the state.

Mohanam, 62, of Pullarkatt in Vaissery near Athirappilly, had stepped outside the house hearing the trumpeting of an elephant. According to local residents, an elephant was roaming the area for the past one week. Though they had alerted the Rapid Response Team (RRT), no action was taken to drive the animal away.

"The incident occurred around 2.45 am. Mohanam lit a torch to scare away the elephant which was feeding on a coconut tree that it uprooted near his brother Girish's house. The elephant charged at Mo-

hanan who was standing on the courtyard of his house. The elephant hit Mohanam with its trunk and trampled him in no time. He died on the spot," said Athirappilly panchayat president K Satheesh Kumar.

"I was at the spot and was recording the elephant on my mobile phone. It turned around and charged at us. Mohanam didn't get the time to escape. We took him to the hospital, but he was already dead," said Stephen, a neighbour.



According to Satheesh, the rogue elephant had attacked three people during the past one week. It had attacked two people riding a two-wheeler three days back. They escaped with injuries. Local residents staged a road blockade on the Chalakudy-Valparai interstate highway at 10 am demanding to translocate the elephant which was posing a threat to their lives. Chalakudy MLA Saneesh Kumar Joseph also joined the protest and contacted the forest minister demanding immediate steps to reduce the conflict.

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"The minister has promised to reach Chalakudy on Monday and hold a meeting to discuss the issue. Thrissur chief conservator of forest R Adalarasan has promised to translocate the elephant. We ended the road blockade after receiving the promise. If the government fails to find a permanent solution, the residents will be forced to intensify the protest," said Satheesh.

A five-year-old girl, Agneemiya, who was travelling with her father, was trampled by a wild elephant in the same area in February 2022. Sebastian, 20, of Adichilthotty Unnathi, was killed by a wild elephant on April 14. Satheesh, 34, and Ambika, 30 — a couple — were killed by a wild elephant when they went to collect forest produce in Vazhachal on April 15. Local residents said though solar fencing has been installed to an extent of 10 km along the forest border in Athirappilly,

the fencing has been damaged and elephants have been roaming the area regularly posing threat to the residents and tourist proceeding to Valparai. There is a permanent presence of elephants in the Oil Palm plantation at Vettillappara.

"We have assured the residents that the elephant will be managed accordingly. The minister will conduct a meeting in Chalakudy on Monday and we will address all the concerns raised by the residents," said Chalakudy DFO Venkitesh.

"Our staff have been striving hard to reduce the conflict in Athirappilly. On Saturday, when Mohanam was attacked by the elephant, an RRT team was driving away another elephant very close to the location. We have been advising people not to provoke elephants. When elephants enter the premises they have to ensure personal safety and should not venture out of their houses," said a senior officer.

"As many as 20 people have died in wild elephant attacks in Thrissur district since 2022. The government should initiate concrete steps to ensure safety of the residents in conflict zones. As many as 11 people have died in wild elephant attacks in the state during the past five months," said Kerala Independent Farmers Association president Alex Ozhukayil.

FOLLOWING the death of 62-year-old Mohanam in a wild elephant attack at Vaissery in Athirappilly on Saturday, residents — led by a joint platform of all local parties — laid siege to Athirappilly-Malakkapara road, seeking a solution to the jumbo menace in the region.

The traffic came to a standstill for over two hours as local residents gathered on the road and staged the protest. The devastation of losing a fellow resident was evident on the faces of the protesters, who raised slogans demanding a solution for the issues faced by the people of the high ranges.

"It was Mohanam (who lost his life) this time. Tomorrow, he could be any of us. Whenever such a death occurs, the authorities console us and promise action, but nothing has happened so far. How many more lives have to be lost before an effective solution is found?" asked Varghese, a resident.

The Kerala Independent Farmers' Association (KIFA) urged the state government to provide a compensation of ₹25 lakh to Mohanam's family and sought an intervention to the rising instances of human-wildlife conflicts in the region which is also a tourist destination.

"Last year, we formed a rapid response team to tackle the issue. However, the team is not currently active due to insufficient funds and staff shortage

at the Athirappilly forest department office," said Noji, a ward member.

"When this elephant started roaming around in residential areas, we informed forest officials. A woman forest official who was on her way to visit the region was attacked by the same elephant, about a week ago. When a herd of wild elephants go on a rampage on farming sites, the crops in the entire region are damaged, causing great loss to farmers. People need a lasting solution to this issue; not temporary relief," she said.

Noji added that the panchayat had urged the forest department to maintain the solar fencing on the borders of the

hills and edges of the river to prevent wild elephants from entering residential areas. However, she said, the forest department did not fulfil the demands.

Last week, two young men who were on a leisure trip were also attacked by the elephant. When they heard the animal approach, they managed to run away but got injured as the tusker managed to hit them with its trunk.

"While other elephants run away if they hear noises or see a 'Pantham' (fire torch), this one comes charging at people. It has to be relocated considering the safety of not just the residents, but also the tourists visiting Athirappilly," Noji said.

Chalakudy MLA Saneesh Kumar Joseph also joined the protesters and assured them to take the matter seriously. He spoke with Forest Minister Shibu Baby John who promised to visit the place on Monday and make the necessary interventions.

## Fraud in land transaction: Panel directs SP to probe

THE Kerala State Human Rights Commission on Saturday directed the Thrissur Rural SP to probe allegations that a middleman cheated a liver disease patient in a real-estate transaction.

Sanjayraj, 44, a native of Kunnankulam, decided to sell 15 cents of land to raise funds for treatment of a liver ailment. According to the complaint, a broker approached him and promised to find a buyer willing to pay ₹4.5 lakh per cent for the property.

The land was subsequently sold to a Malappuram native. However, Sanjayraj alleged that the broker paid him only ₹4 lakh and failed to respond to repeated queries regarding the remaining amount.

Though Sanjayraj approached the police, no case was registered as the matter was treated as a civil dispute. He also submitted a complaint to the collector but received no relief. He then approached the Commission seeking intervention. The Commission has directed the SP to investigate and submit a report within 15 days.

## NIA conducts raids across north Kerala in explosive seizure case

THE National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Saturday unleashed a coordinated crackdown across north Kerala, conducting extensive raids in connection with the seizure of massive illegal explosives in February from Malappuram.

Multiple NIA teams launched simultaneous searches at 7am across at least six strategic locations. The raid stems from an incident on February 7, when lo-

cal police intercepted a transport truck in Chemmad, near Tirurangadi in Malappuram. The vehicle, seemingly transporting onion sacks, was found carrying explosives, including 10,500 pieces of nonel (non-electric detonators) and 89,600 pieces of explosive sticks, which are used as a substitute for gelatin sticks.

While the police initially arrested six people at the scene, the key accused, Haris Thenjeri-

param, went into hiding. The accused had claimed the consignment was for a local quarry, but subsequent verification revealed that none of the involved people actually possessed a quarry or license. Recognising the severe security implications, the case was transferred from the Tirurangadi police to the NIA.

Key search sites included the residence and industrial unit 'Excellent Bricks' of Haris, located in Eranjimavu near

Mukkam in Kozhikode. Parallel searches targeted second accused, Shareef, in Mukkam, fifth accused Nizar in Kozhikode, and sixth accused Irshad, also in Mukkam.

In Malappuram, officials combed through the Chemmad hollow bricks warehouse where the shipment landed, alongside the residence of the seventh accused and facility employee, Kamaruddin, in Kodinhi.

Investigators also raided a residence in Wandoor belonging to Hajira, the third wife of the

vehicle's owner and third accused, Muhammad Saleem. Saleem's primary residence in Seethangoli Mugu, Kasaragod, was hit in a morning raid.

Meanwhile, in Kannur, the NIA team thoroughly searched the Chunda residence of the fourth accused and truck driver, Anilkumar. He was not present during the raid, leaving only his parents at the house to face investigators. Anilkumar had previously spent two months in judicial custody following his initial arrest by local police.

## Maha native held with ₹19.6L hawala money

Palakkad: The Shoranur police on Saturday arrested a Maharashtra native and seized ₹19.6 lakh in hawala money from his possession. The police said Santhosh, 33, was earlier arrested by Palakkad police for smuggling ₹33 lakh in hawala money. Santhosh was seen carrying a big bag under suspicious circumstances and waiting for a bus near Shoranur railway station, following which he was arrested.
