

Women reply to naysayers with driving licences

Telangana police distribute 50 e-bikes, four e-autos to women in *Sthree Ride* programme

WOMEN Safety Wing (WSW), Telangana, launched *Sthree Ride*, a women drivers initiative under the Stand With Her campaign on Saturday. DGP CV Anand and WSW chief Charu Sinha inaugurated the programme, where they handed over 50 electric bikes and four electric autorickshaws to women drivers.

The initiative has been taken to empower women and overcome the frequent women safety complaints from transport facilities, including Metro, buses and bike taxis. DGP told the women drivers not to give up for at least six months.

Charu Sinha said that the

initiative was important because "We keep getting frequent complaints about misbehaviour from buses, cabs, Metro, bikes and other transport facilities".

One of the beneficiaries, Nalla Lovely from Saidabad, told TNIE, "Women are belittled everywhere. My own family would discourage me and prevent me from becoming a driver. With the help of WSW's *Sthree Ride* initiative, I will be able to give a befitting reply to all those who said that women can't drive."

"My biggest detractor is my own brother. After hearing that I was going to become a driver, he mocked me, saying how many people I was going to kill in accidents. I will give him a befitting reply with my driv-

ing licence," she added.

Lovely is a degree dropout, and she reportedly used to work as a labourer at construction sites. "When I recently saw the news about driving, I approached the officials concerned and learnt how to drive. My biggest motivation to come into this profession is to tell my naysayers that I did not care about your discouraging remarks and here I am driving anyway," she said.

Archana, a vegetable vendor,

was finding it difficult to make ends meet after her husband died a few years ago. With the very little money she earned, she wanted to take on the driver's profession and approached the WSW officials who taught her driving.

Another woman, N Durga Bhavani, a techie, said she was motivated to join the women drivers' fleet after her sister faced misbehaviour by a male rider. "I do not want women to be dependent on male drivers."

37 bikes, 2 autos seized in cordon op in Khammam

A cordon and search operation was conducted in Ayyappa Colony and Revenue Colony under the jurisdiction of Bhadrachalam police station on Saturday morning. The operation was conducted under the supervision of Bhadrachalam DSP Arun Kumar.

During the inspections, police seized 37 two-wheelers and two autorickshaws that were found without valid documents or proper license plates.

Following the operation, the DSP held an interaction with locals and issued several advisories. He warned that strict action would be taken against those found involved in the illegal transportation and consumption of narcotic substances. He also explained the harmful effects of ganja and other intoxicants.

DSP Arun Kumar urged the public to remain vigilant against cybercrimes and educate them on road safety regulations. He advised two-wheeler riders to wear helmets at all times and strictly adhere to traffic rules.

Nepali couple among 4 arrested in robbery case

MALKAJIRI police arrested four persons, including a Nepali couple, in connection with a robbery at Jawaharnagar. The arrested persons were identified as Rajesh, his wife Meena alias Mamatha, Kiran, all from Nepal, and Daniel Charoh from Darjeeling in West Bengal.

According to police, the robbery took place on May 11 at the residence of an elderly couple. The accused allegedly tied the hands and legs of the couple and administered an intoxicating substance before escaping with about 60 tolas of gold ornaments, 15 kg of silver articles, USD 3,000, two mobile phones and other valuables.

Police said Meena had allegedly secured another accused, Sabeena, employment as a housemaid at the victims' residence. On the day of the offence, taking advantage of a birthday celebration in the servants' quarters, five members of the gang allegedly entered the house while others waited outside the gated community to as-

sisit in their escape.

Following the incident, six special teams were formed and footage from nearly 255 CCTV cameras was analysed. Police conducted searches in New Delhi, Lucknow, Bengaluru, Pune, Mumbai and Nepal before arresting four key accused.

Police found that fingerprints recovered from the crime scene matched those of Meena alias Mamatha. Investigators also discovered that Meena and Rajesh were previously involved in a house-breaking case registered at Moinabad police station in 2023.



'Mee Suraksha'

In the wake of the incident, the Malkajiri Commissionerate of Police launched a special community safety initiative titled "Mee Suraksha", under which police personnel are conducting door-to-door verification of domestic servants, housemaids, drivers, caretakers, watchmen and other household staff. Police said details of 39,270 domestic workers had already been collected under the initiative, including 1,276 Nepali nationals.

All set for fish prasadam distribution from Monday

HYDERABAD in-charge Minister Ponnampal Prabhakar on Friday directed officials to ensure seamless arrangements for the annual fish prasadam distribution at the Exhibition Ground, Nampally.

As many as 1.4 lakh murrel fish fingerlings will be arranged for the event scheduled to begin at 9 pm on June 8. The distribution will continue through June 9 until the last beneficiary receives the prasadam. Authorities have set up distribution counters, barricades and queue management systems to handle the large influx of asthma patients and devotees expected during Mri-

gasira Karthi.

A central control room and dedicated WhatsApp group have been established to coordinate arrangements among departments. Police will maintain round-the-clock surveillance through CCTV cameras and the control room, besides implementing traffic and crowd-management measures to prevent overcrowding and stampedes.

SHE Teams will also be deployed, while public announcements will caution visitors against pickpockets.

Fans and coolers are being installed along queue lines, while uninterrupted drinking water and power supply will be ensured throughout the programme.

OFFICIALS FACE ACTION OVER FORMATION DAY LAPSES

DISTRICT Collector K Hymavathi initiated action against officials for alleged negligence during the Telangana State Formation Day celebrations. The collector recommended action against Siddipet Municipal Commissioner Ashrith Kumar for inadequate arrangements at the Degree College grounds, where the celebrations were held.

Based on her report, Director of Municipal Administration TK Sreedevi issued orders suspending the Municipal Commissioner.

The collector also issued show-cause notices to 15 district officials and around 150 staff members for failing to attend the official programme. Officials said she expressed displeasure over the large number of empty chairs at the venue during the celebrations.

Meanwhile, Sangareddy Collector Pratik Jain suspended Nagalgidda Mandal Development Officer Spandana for not attending the State Formation Day celebrations.

I booked for duping man of ₹14L in land scam

Adilabad: Mavala police have registered a case against a person for allegedly duping a victim of ₹14 lakh using forged land documents. The accused, 38-year-old Dharavath Praveen Naik, is a resident of Mallangi village, Narnool mandal. SHO BD Prem Kumar said the victim, Patkuri Satyanarayana from Adilabad, lodged a complaint on Saturday.

Ganja racket operating from pan shop busted

Hyderabad: Acting on a complaint, the EAGLE Force, in coordination with the Jagadgirigutta Police, cracked down on a ganja network operating in Jagadgirigutta and its adjoining areas, on February 23. Two suspects, Shaik Ahmed and Shaik Avezuddin—both pan shop owners—and eight consumers were apprehended.

Man sells cigarettes to minors, booked

Hyderabad: A kirana shopkeeper was booked by the Alwal Police on June 4 for allegedly selling tobacco products to minors near an educational institution. While on patrol, police caught a 16-year-old boy purchasing cigarettes from Om Sai Nath Kirana Store, located within 100m of a school. The minor admitted to being a regular customer.

Cop killed as oncoming lorry rams bike

Medak: A 35-year-old constable was killed after an oncoming lorry rammed his motorcycle in Ramayampet on Saturday. The victim, S Mahipal from Shivampet police in Narsapur constituency, was returning to his native village, Komatipally. He is survived by his wife and three children. A case was registered and an investigation is under way.

CP visits burnt house, orders detailed probe

Nizamabad: Police Commissioner P Sai Chaitanya on Saturday visited the residence of Rajamallu in Pipri village of Armur mandal, which was allegedly set on fire on Friday. He inspected the burnt house and reviewed the circumstances surrounding the incident. He also enquired about the condition of the victim's family and assured them of support.

The Parents Association of Medical Colleges (PAMC) has alleged that two private medical colleges in Karimnagar are violating regulations and illegally collecting excess fees from parents. Aggrieved parents have lodged a formal complaint with the vice-chancellor of Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, expressing serious concern over the alleged practices. The complaint has since gone viral on social



media platforms. According to PAMC, the colleges are violating guidelines laid down by the National Medical Commission and the Telangana State Fee Regulatory Com-

mittee. Parents alleged that while fee structures remain uniform in other medical colleges, these two institutions are demanding several lakhs of rupees in excess fees and are allegedly intimidating parents who raise objections.

The association claimed that despite university directions permitting fee collection only for a four-and-a-half-year MBBS course, the colleges are allegedly forcing students to pay fees for five full years. Parents further alleged that college

managements threaten to cancel internships and even issue legal notices whenever questions are raised regarding the fee structure.

Demanding immediate government intervention, the parents urged authorities to take stringent action against the colleges, alleging that the institutions are operating unchecked due to political backing. Copies of the complaint were also tagged to the chief minister, prime minister, and other ministers.
